TOWN OF WOLFEBORO BUDGET COMMITTEE January 7, 2016

Minutes

Chairman MacDonald called the meeting to order at 6:05 PM at the Wolfeboro Public Library.

FINAL BUDGET REVIEW

Final budget review continued from 12/22/15.

Parks and Recreation

Administration

Pete Chamberlain reviewed the changes to the 2016 budget relative to supervisory salaries (recalculation of Director and Assistant Director's salary), see attached. He noted a reduction in the amount of \$11,056 (includes 100 & 200 series, salaries and benefits).

It was moved by John Burt and seconded by Bob Moholland to decrease Supervisory Salaries 01-45201-113 and adjust the 200 series accordingly by \$11,056 per the Analysis of 2016 Budget Changes Due To Director Position. All members voted in favor. The motion passed.

6:33 PM; Steve Johnson arrived.

Parks and Recreation Capital Outlay 01-49616-730 Foss Field Shed; \$7,624

John MacDonald submitted photographs of the existing shed at Foss Field; noting the building appears to be in good condition.

Bob Tougher noted issues with the interior of the structure.

Christine Collins, Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation, stated the shed has a broken panel in which water seeps in; noting an odor in the shed. She stated the foundation of the shed is uneven and air quality is poor.

John MacDonald questioned the ability to store equipment at the Community Center and the snack bar building.

Christine Collins stated equipment cannot be stored at the Community Center and the baseball league tore down the snack bar building and did not rebuild.

Dave Owen noted mildew issues at the Community Center.

John MacDonald questioned the future plan for the area.

Linda Murray stated restrooms and a canopied area, similar to the structure at The Nick, are proposed. She stated the proposed future structure does not address equipment storage for the other end of Foss Field.

Fire/Rescue

Medical Services 01-42200-350

Dave Owen noted a reduction in Medical Services, specifically Ambulance Contract, in the amount of \$7,052.

It was moved by Bob Moholland and seconded by Bob Tougher to decrease Medical Services 01-42200-350, specifically Ambulance Contract in the amount of \$7,052, from \$260,391 to \$253,339. All members voted in favor. The motion passed.

2016 Budget; Gasoline Accounts

Dave Owen reported a reduction in all gasoline accounts to reflect a cost of \$2.50/gallon (reduction by .25); noting a total reduction in the overall 2016 budget in the amount of \$11,500, see attached.

It was moved by Bob Tougher and seconded by Harold Parker to decrease the Gasoline/Gasoline & Oil accounts in the 2016 Budget, account #635, by \$11,500 per the Analysis of Potential Reduction in 2016 Gasoline Budget. All members voted in favor. The motion passed.

DEFAULT BUDGET

Pete Chamberlain stated the amount of the default budget is \$25,202,280; noting such is set at the prior year's budget not including legal, contractual and one-time expenses.

Consideration of Minutes
December 22, 2015

It was moved by Frank Giebutowski and seconded by Bob Tougher to approve the December 22, 2015 Budget Committee minutes as submitted. All members voted in favor. The motion passed.

Other Business

- Budget Committee Public Hearing scheduled for 1/12/16, 7 PM at the Wolfeboro Public Library
- Deliberative Session scheduled for 2/2/16, 7 PM at the Great Hall, Brewster Building
- BOS voted in favor, 5-0, on all warrant articles

Steve Johnson expressed concern regarding the continuous increase in taxes and noted that at some point the Committee needs to say no to requests. He stated the budget is not acceptable and wants the warrant articles incorporated into the operating budget.

Bob Tougher stated the CIP Committee reviews projects thoroughly and has denied projects. He stated all warrant articles including the operating budget have always been overwhelmingly approved. He stated it is difficult not to increase the budget when the cost of living continues to increase. He noted five other towns on the lake have higher taxes than Wolfeboro.

Steve Johnson stated a lot of people don't realize the impact; noting that the budget increases annually and Town management becomes larger and larger year after year.

Harold Parker stated he feels the voters are aware of the issues and noted the Committee's vote on warrant articles are never overturned.

Bob Tougher stated he would submit the CIP spreadsheet for review and input by the Committee.

John Burt stated he does not feel that the budget represents the total operating cost of the Town. Referencing the capital reserve accounts, he stated the replacement of equipment and scheduled maintenance is an operating expense and should be included in the operating budget.

Linda Murray stated funds from the capital reserve accounts cannot be deposited into the operating budget. She noted the BOS have received Town Counsel opinion regarding such.

John Burt stated the funds should be placed in the operating budget and transferred to the capital reserve accounts annually.

Dave Owen noted capital reserve accounts prevent the spiking of the tax rate.

It was moved by Harold Parker and seconded by John Burt to adjourn the January 7, 2016 Budget Committee meeting. All members voted in favor.

There being no further business before the Committee, the meeting adjourned at 7:00 PM.
