TOWN OF WOLFEBORO BUDGET COMMITTEE APPROVED MINUTES December 27, 2022

I. Call To Order

Chairman MacDonald opened the meeting at 6:05 pm at the Wolfeboro Public Library.

<u>Members Present</u>: John MacDonald, Chairman, Bob Tougher, Vice-Chairman, John Burt, Bob Loughman, Brian Black, Tom Bell, Matt Plache, Members, Brian Deshaies, BOS Representative, Linda Murray, BOS Alternate Representative.

Members Absent: Bob Moholland, Steve Johnson, Members (both excused).

<u>Staff Present:</u> Jim Pineo, Town Manager, Kathy Carpentier, Finance Director, Christine Collins, Parks and Recreation, Lee Ann Hendrickson, Administrative Assistant.

The Committee participated in the pledge of allegiance.

II. <u>2023 Budget</u>

REVISIT ITEMS

Parks & Recreation; Brewster Beach Septic

Christine Collins stated she received a quote for \$11,960 for the project; noting she had originally requested \$10,000. She requested an increase in the funding request to \$11,960.

John MacDonald asked when the project would begin.

Christine Collins replied spring 2023.

John MacDonald asked if the system is on Town land.

Jim Pineo stated the intent is to put the septic on Town land.

John MacDonald asked if anyone has spoken to Brewster about the project.

Christine Collins stated she has not.

It was moved by John Burt and seconded by Bob Tougher to increase Parks and Recreation Capital Outlay Brewster Beach Septic from \$10,000 to \$11,960. All members voted in favor. The motion passed.

Parks and Recreation; Baseball Field Improvements

Christine Collins stated she originally requested \$60,000 for improvements to the baseball field however, received an estimate for \$10,000 for materials. She requested a decrease in the funding request to \$10,000.

<u>It was moved by Bob Tougher and seconded by Tom Bell to decrease Parks and Recreation</u> <u>Capital Outlay Baseball Field Improvements from \$60,000 to \$10,000. All members voted in</u> <u>favor. The motion passed.</u>

III. Warrant Articles

Jim Pineo reviewed the timeline for the bond hearings and warrant articles, see attached presentation.

Article E – Municipal Electric Utility Boat; \$170,000

Jim Pineo read and reviewed such.

Article F – Mini Excavator; \$130,000

Jim Pineo read and reviewed such; noting the equipment would be used by the Highway, Water and Sewer Departments. He noted the equipment is an expansion of the fleet.

John Burt confirmed the Town will contract out projects in the future.

Article G – Sewer Pump Stations Upgrades; \$648,000 Jim Pineo read and reviewed such.

Article J – AFSCME Contract; \$107,733

Jim Pineo read and reviewed such.

John MacDonald questioned the percentage increase of such.

Jim Pineo stated year one reflects a 5% increase and year two reflects a 3.5% increase.

John MacDonald asked how such affects the nonunion employees.

Jim Pineo stated nonunion employees would be receiving a 5% increase. He stated a wage and benefit study is proposed for 2023; noting the last one that was done was 2016.

Kathy Carpentier stated the study would be Town wide.

Article K – Police Union Contract; \$64,780

Jim Pineo read and reviewed such. He stated year one reflects a percentage increase of 5.5% and year two reflects a percentage increase of 3%.

John MacDonald confirmed the contract includes Communications employees.

Kathy Carpentier stated the Police Department reflects 11 positions and Communications reflects 6 positions.

John MacDonald confirmed the medical benefits are the same for both unions.

Article L – Town Road Upgrades; \$850,000

Jim Pineo read and reviewed such.

John Burt asked if the Town has a capital reserve for such.

Jim Pineo replied no.

Article L2 – Green Street Upgrade; \$530,000

Jim Pineo read and reviewed such.

John Burt questioned the tax impact.

Kathy Carpentier stated there is no current year tax impact.

Article M – Readoption of Veterans Tax Credits

Jim Pineo read and reviewed such.

John MacDonald asked if such includes spouses.

Jim Pineo replied yes.

Jim Pineo stated the Town has received one petition warrant article; noting that another is expected. He stated the deadline for the submittal of a petition warrant article is January 10th.

The amount of \$26,000 shall be funded from the Water Enterprise Fund. The amount of \$26,000 shall be funded from the Sewer Enterprise Fund. This appropriation is non-lapsing pursuant to RSA 32:7,VI and shall lapse on December 31, 2024, or upon completion of the project whichever occurs first.

Article G – Sewer Pump Station Upgrades

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$648,000 for the purpose of paying for increased cost of engineering, equipment, construction and inspections of the Lehner and Mill Street sewer pump stations. This appropriation is non-lapsing pursuant to RSA 32:7.VI and shall lapse on December 31, 2024, or upon completion of the project whichever occurs first.

This will be paid from State Aid Grant in the amount of \$648,000 over the next 5 years from the RIB Project which would result in no tax rate impact.

This appropriation is non-lapsing pursuant to RSA 32:7, VI and shall lapse on December 31, 2024, or upon completion of the project, whichever occurs first. This appropriation shall not result in any increase to the tax rate.

Article L2 – Green Street Upgrade

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$530,000 for the purpose of upgrading Green Street. Funds shall be utilized for engineering fees, storm water drainage systems, the replacement of water and sewer mains and rebuilding the roadway.

\$100,000 from the Water Enterprise Fund shall be for the purpose of engineering and replacing vintage water mains which service Green Street.

\$430,000 from general taxation shall be for the purpose of engineering and replacing the existing sewer main in Green Street, storm water drainage systems and rebuilding of Green Street.

This appropriation is non-lapsing pursuant to RSA 32:7, VI and shall lapse on December 31, 2024, or upon completion of the project, whichever occurs first.

If readopted, the All-Veterans' Tax Credit, previously adopted, will also be \$500 per year, the same amount as the Optional Veterans Tax Credit. If readopted and approved, this article shall take effect for the 2023 property tax year.

The school district, SAU49, shall pay the Town of Wolfeboro 50% of payroll and benefits which is \$22,338, for this position for up to 73 school days (August 2023 – December 2023), outlined below.
