

**New Library Services:**

The library has added a language learning program to its growing collection of online resources that can be accessed through the library's website. The new program, called Mango Languages, helps patrons learn a new language or make translations in an easy, straightforward and self-paced manner. The Mango Languages database can be used at the library or by library patrons from home.

**Staff Development:**

Two all-staff-work-days were held during May. Staff focused on completing special projects prior to the start of the busy summer season. Projects included preparation for the Summer Reading Program and weeding in the non-fiction collection.

**Staff Changes:**

Whitney Prigge, who has been the library's administrative assistant since June 2010, resigned to take a job in the Tax Collector's Office. Her replacement, Peggy Hawksley, began work on May 23rd.

**Programming:**

The library presented 17 programs in May including story time sessions, book discussion programs, a Friday afternoon film series, visits to nursery schools and a classic film. Two hundred seventy-three people attended the various programs.

**Statistics:**

There were 7,016 visitors to the library in May. The number of questions asked by library patrons increased 116% as compared to May 2010 figures with 694 questions asked. Non-book figures increased by 45% with 4,008 items circulating. Book circulation figures decreased by 8% with 4,728 books checked out. Overall May circulation figures increased by 11% over May 2010 figures with 8,736 items circulating. Usage of the library's Internet workstations remained the same with 867 users (figure does not include wireless usage).
