

SELECTMEN SUSPEND SEARCH FOR NEW TOWN MANAGER
AND RETAIN OWEN FOR TWO MORE YEARS

The Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen is pleased to announce that it has retained the services of Town Manager David Owen for a minimum of at least two more years. This decision occurred after Owen signaled his willingness to rescind his intent to retire from Town service this spring and to continue serving as Wolfeboro's Town Manager for a few more years. Presented with this change of plans, the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen voted unanimously to suspend the search for a new Town Manager effective immediately, and to continue retaining the services of Owen as Town Manager, with the understanding that he will continue in that capacity for a minimum of at least two more years. In addition, Owen agreed to compensate the Town for any and all expenses incurred by the Town to date in its search for a new Town Manager, which will make the Town and its taxpayers whole for those costs incurred in hiring the consulting firm MRI to conduct the Town Manager recruitment process for the Town. On behalf of the Board of Selectmen, Chairman Dave Senecal stated: "We are all delighted that Mr. Owen, who has so capably served as Town Manager in recent years, has agreed to extend his term of office."
