Currently:

- 1. Brewster has the right to remove ANY signs from their property as the property owner
- 2. Only signs for non-profit agencies may be placed on Brewster property and Town property.
- 3. No political signs are allowed.
- 4. No signs from competitive schools are allowed on Brewster property.
- 5. No offense signs are allowed anywhere.
- 6. If Brewster is making changes to the rules for signs on their property, town ordinances do not need to be changed with a town vote or a warrant article.
- 7. Signs must be no larger than 48 Sq ft.
- 8. Signs may go up 14 days prior to an event and must come down within two (2) days after the event.
- 9. No signs will be permitted in front of or close to the memorial monuments on South Main Street.

New:

- 1. A new temporary sign form will be drafted by Jason Durrance, Wolfeboro Codes Officer
- 2. The new form will include simple, clear definitions and instructions.
- 3. Brewster would allow four (4) signs to be placed at any one time from 100' from the first tree toward the church after the bench.
- 4. The town will allow two (2) signs in the South Main Street open lot (where former playground was) Davis's home and Weston's Auto Body.
- 5. Only one sign per non-profit group is permitted at one time per location.
- 6. Enforcement will come from both Brewster and the Town of Wolfeboro Codes Department.

Process:

- 1. Applicant gets temporary event form and/or sign forms online or in person at Town Hall
- 2. Applicant completes all sections of the form(s).
- 3. Applicant brings it or emails it to Town Manager Admin Assistant -currently Amy Muccio
- 4. Temporary event form goes to Wolfeboro Selectman for approval or denial
- 5. Town sends sign form to Brewster online for a *docusign* signature
- 6. Brewster sends signed form back to Town and then Town signs by docusign.
- 7. Both Brewster and Town will track sign requests and permission with a shared spreadsheet.
