Chairman Coons opened the meeting at the Town Hall Annex Conference Room.

**Frank Sokol Revocable Trust**  
7 Wyanoke Gate Lane  
Lake Winnepesaukee  
Standard Dredge & Fill  
Tax Map #227-50

The applicant proposes to install one fender pile and one 14'x30' seasonal canopy.

*The Wolfeboro Conservation Commission noted no objection to the Frank Sokol Revocable Trust Standard Dredge & Fill application, Tax Map #227-50, as submitted.*

**74 Oakwood 2013 Revocable Trust**  
Oakwood Road  
Lake Winnepesaukee  
Permit By Notification  
Tax Map #259-81

The applicant proposes to install a residential sewer pump line across a wetland to a proposed leach bed; temporary access across the wetland is needed to construct the leach bed. Fill to be removed from wetland crossing after completion of leach field.

*Referencing the 74 Oakwood 2013 Revocable Trust Permit By Notification application, Tax Map #259-81, the Wolfeboro Conservation Commission noted no objection to the proposal however, would prefer a temporary bridge to cross the wetlands rather than temporary fill of the wetlands.*

**Paul & Jena Slosberg**  
191 Connolly Way  
Lake Wentworth  
Minimum Impact Expedited  
Tax Map #191-18

The applicant proposes to replace existing retaining walls, replace and expand existing rip-rap, replace existing steps with new steps behind the reference line, add concrete pad for lift-out dock, replace existing dock with 6'x40' dock, add infiltration area behind the steps and add a walkway to the deck.

*Referencing the Paul & Jena Slosberg Minimum Impact Expedited application, Tax Map #191-18, the Wolfeboro Conservation Commission reviewed and noted the current conditions on the ground. The Commission is in favor of preventing erosion into the lake and if the alternative is adding boulders to the shoreline, has no objection. If the proposal is to build a conventional retaining wall, the Commission objects to such as the Commission feels that retaining walls cause more problems ecologically than they solve. The Commission is also not in favor of using manufactured rip rap on the shorefront, but that a natural boulder border would be appropriate.*
