The Libby Museum warrant article (although WA pdraft not in hand) was discussed and the attendees drafted the following statement of support to be submitted to the BoS:

"The Heritage Commission unanimously favors preservation of the Libby Museum Building. It is one of four Wolfeboro sites listed in the National Register of Historic Places. We, the Wolfeboro Heritage Commission urge the Board of Selectmen to recommend this warrant article to the voters."

Maggie revised and submitted the information on the Freight House to the Division of Historical Resources to be listed.

Goals for 2020-

Barn Tour in the Fall, and possible winter speaker. There was mention that we expend our efforts on thoroughly publicizing the Charrette and getting maximum public participation.

Other business-

Discussion of the Warrant Article opening up certain areas for drive thru businesses evolved. Concerns were raised about the various impacts.
