

Wolfeboro Police Commission Meeting Minutes August 24, 2023

Members present: Chairman Steve Wood, Commissioner Robert O'Brien (via phone), and Commissioner Shawn Coope

Staff present: Chief Stu Chase and Captain Mark Livie

Chairman Wood informed the public that the meeting was called to order at 2:30 PM and then the Commission went into Non-Public session and then reentered into public session and called a short recess and began the meeting at 4:02 PM.

Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Wood entertained the Pledge of Allegiance.

Consideration of Minutes

Chairman Wood entertained a motion to accept the July 27, 2023, minutes as presented.

Commissioner O'Brien moved the Wolfeboro Police Commission to accept the July 27, 2023, public minutes as presented. Commissioner Coope seconded. Members voted, all in favor, the motion passed.

Captain's Items

Captain Livie read the Monthly Activity reports. The Captain also shared that the Police budget is looking really good and included month-to-date budget information with his report. Report and slides attached.

Activity Reports

Captain Livie reported on the following activity reports for the month of July:

Incidents: He reported 33 incidents, a decrease from the previous month.

Offenses by month: He reported 71 offenses for the month.

Arrest status report: He reported an increase of 9.38% in arrests from the previous month, for a total of 35.

Collisions report: He reported good news that there was a decrease and there were 20 collisions in July. Center Street is one of the big streets that have accidents.

Traffic stops report: He reported 224 traffic stops, a decrease from last month, and 18 tickets were issued out of those stops.

Chairman Wood inquired about the speed devices that the Department has – the two-pole mounted and a trailer?

Captain Livie clarified that we have four standalone that are mounted in the ground and the radar trailer. He let the public know that the Forest Rd. radar needs to have the battery replaced, that is why it is not working.

Chairman Wood presented a request to have the radar trailer put back out due to school starting. The request asks it to be put out in the Wolfeboro Falls area, near Birch Road. Wanted to pass on the request.

Captain Livie said he would pass the request on to Sergeant Beaulieu.

Chairman Wood shared that the next Police Commission meeting is Thursday, September 21, 2023, to be held in the Bradley Room at the Wolfeboro Public Library.

Budget Committee's Representative

Budget Committee member, Tom Bell shared that the Budget Committee members are waiting for Department Heads to meet with Selectmen and then start their part of the budget process.

Board of Selectmen's Representative

Brian Deshaies, Selectmen representative, shared two items: the Selectmen have approved the Dispatch console and asked if it is on order?

Commissioner Wood responded that he signed the purchase order, so he assumes it has been.

Brian Deshaies responded that that's the first step. The second point of information that he shared is about signage that will be put up for cross country skiing, walking, and biking up at Abenaki. The signage will disclose caution areas for the spray areas.

Chairman Wood inquired about the timing of when they spray.

Brian Deshaies shared that it is all random depending on weather conditions and ground conditions.

Chairman Wood asked if the bike trails can be "hit" by the spray?

Brian Deshaies shared that there is a main trail that carries the power lines and water lines, and that main trail has become the first one everyone uses. A lot of the entrances are within the 100-foot buffer. More work to be done on some of the older trails.

Brian Deshaies also shared a suggestion that came his way related to traffic flow. A discussion ensued about what is to come with the road construction and traffic that is about to occur over the next five years.

Public Comment

Bernie Wilensky shared that where he lives on Ambrose way, he was unaware of the Town letting the spray go and has not smelled it.

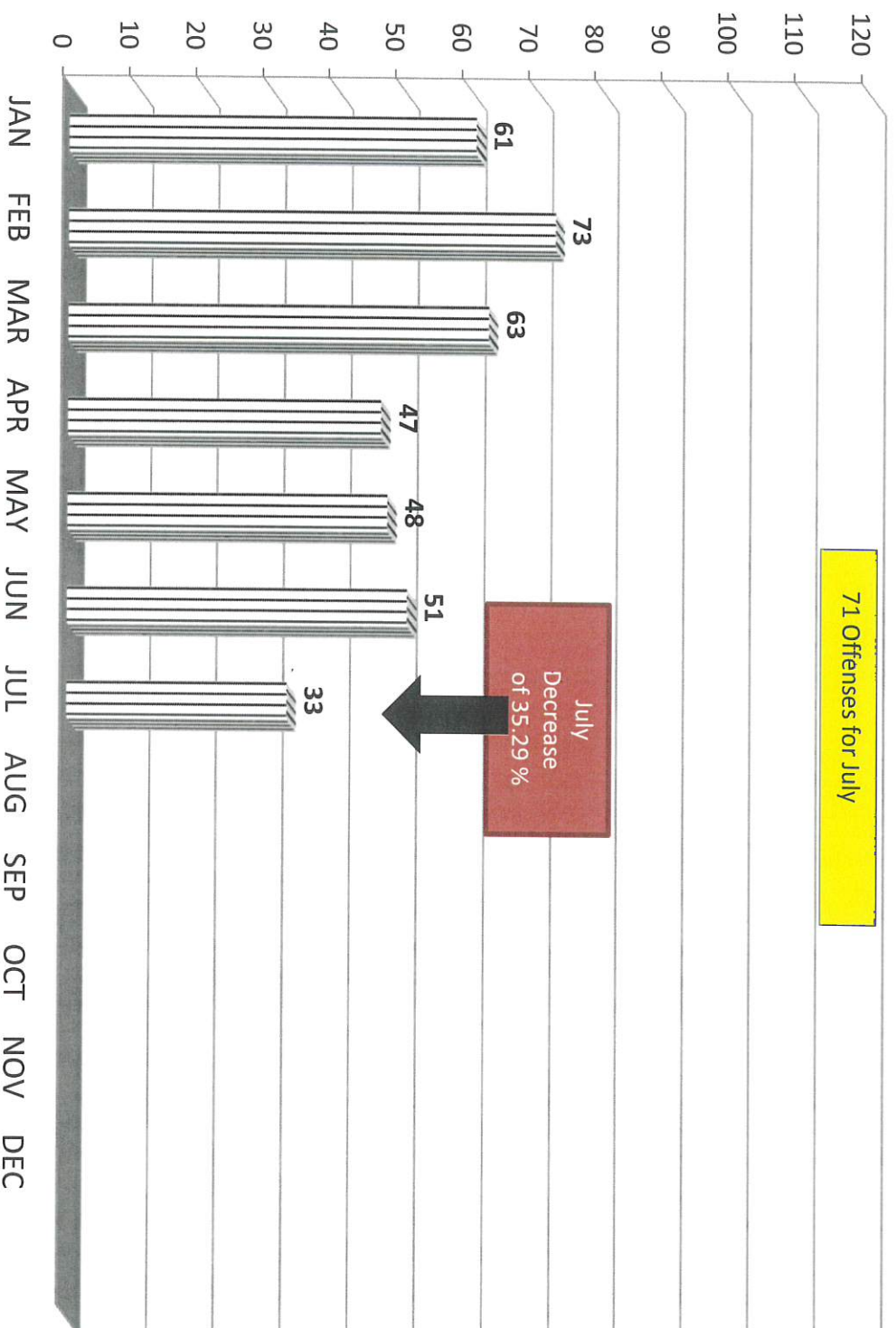

Being no further business before the Commission, Chairman Wood entertained a motion to adjourn.

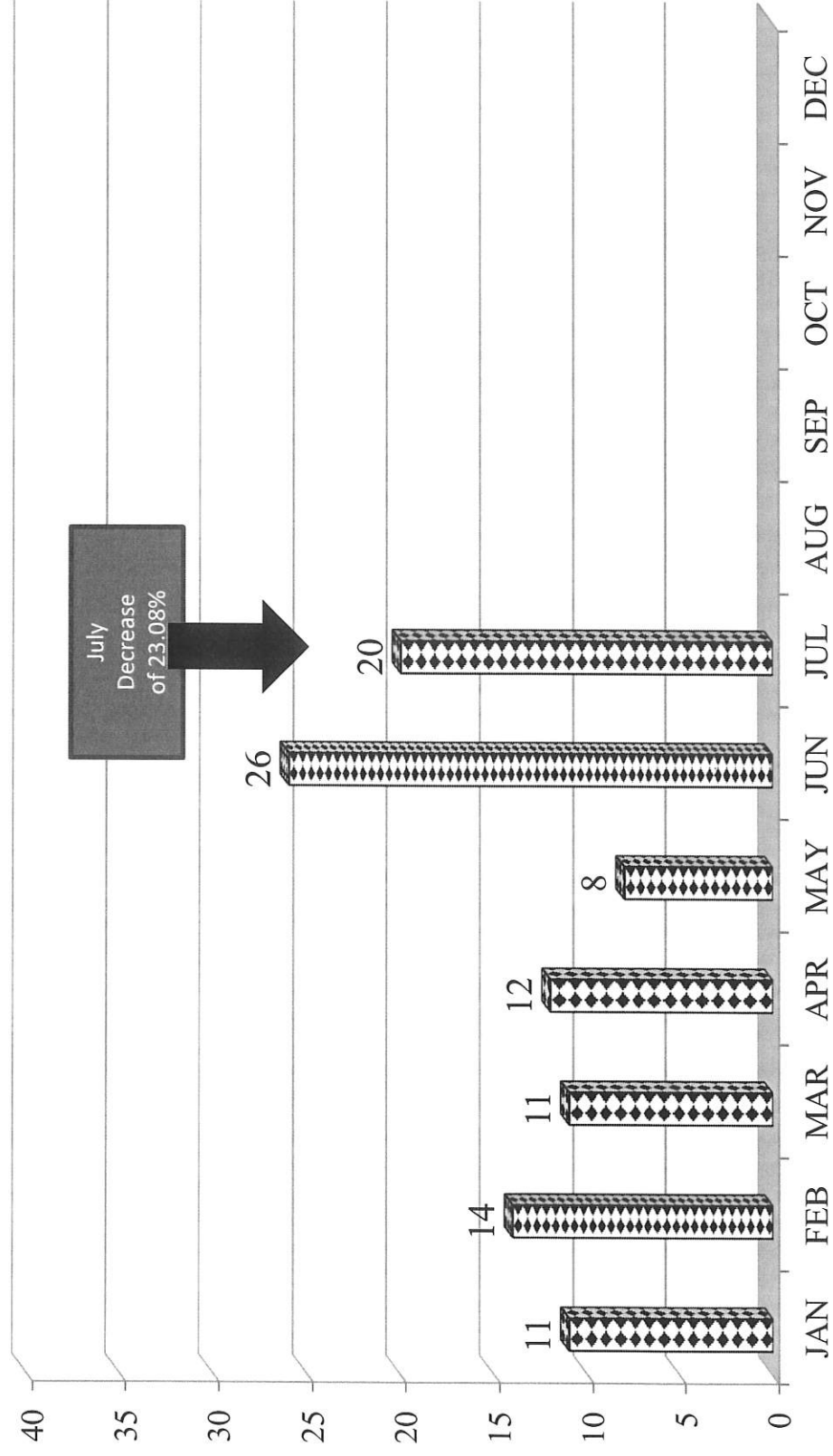
Commissioner O'Brien moved the Wolfeboro Police Commission to adjourn at 4:33 PM.

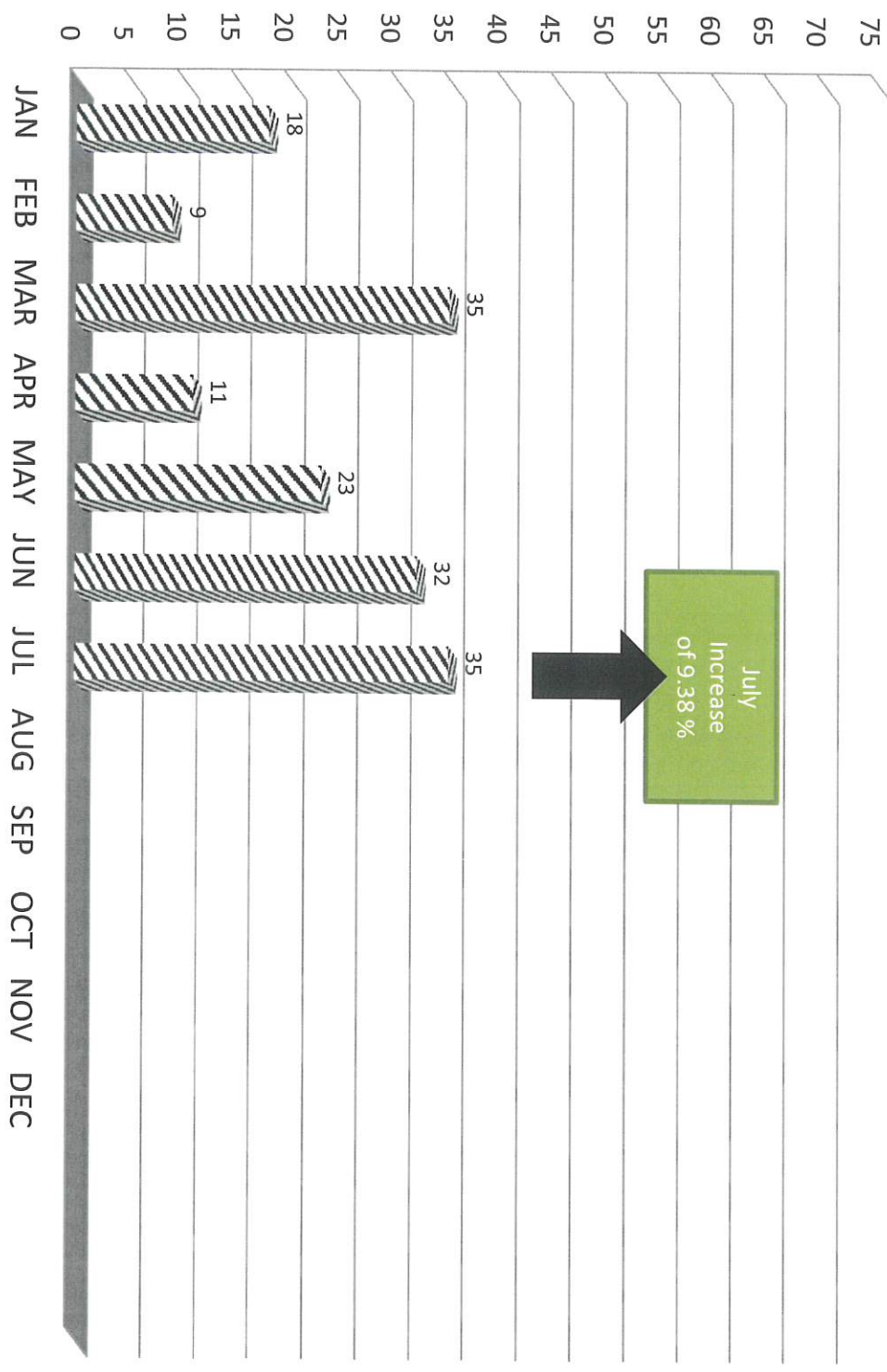
INCIDENTS (CASES) YTD 2023



COLLISIONS YTD 2023



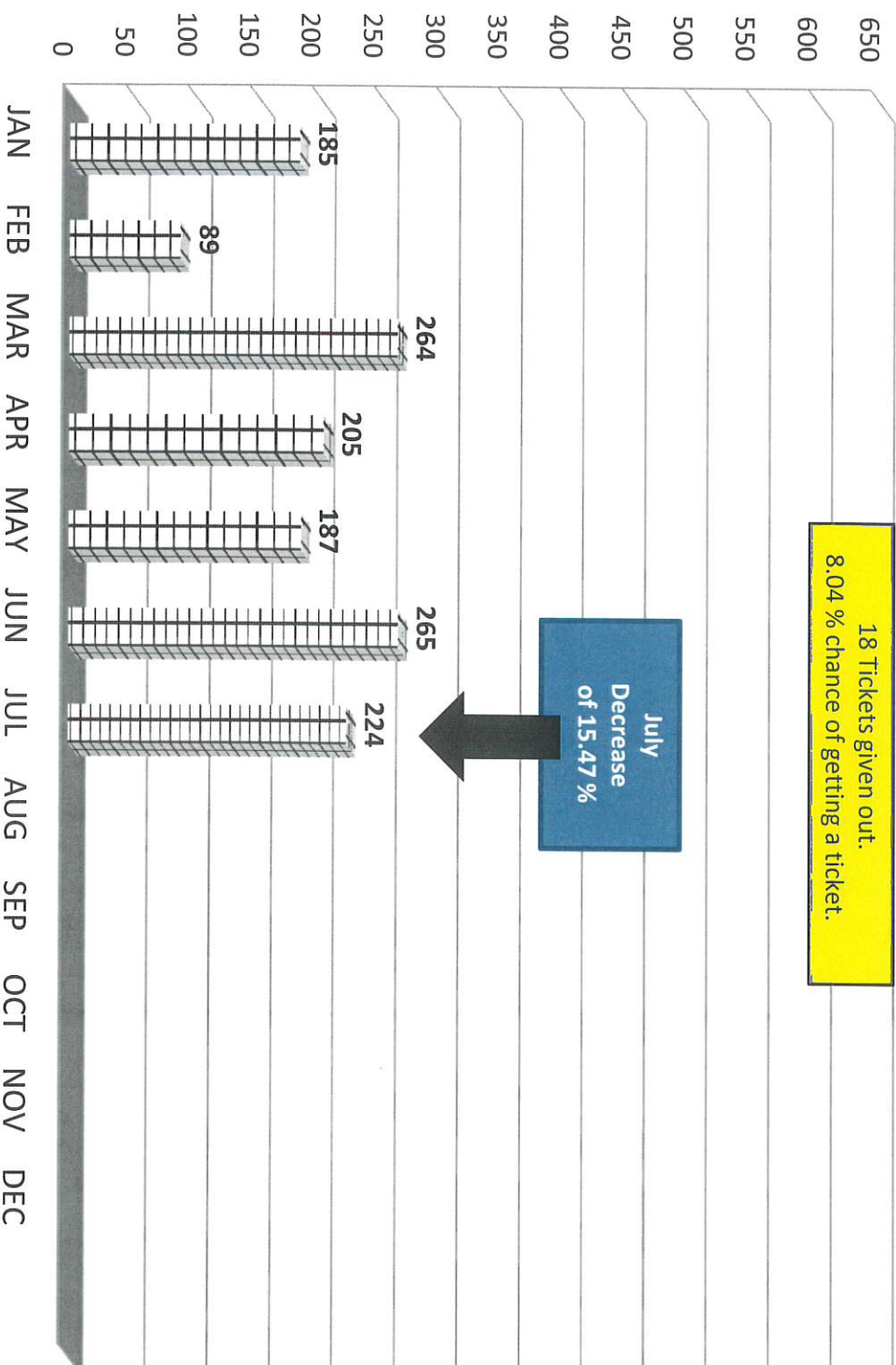
ARRESTS YTD 2023

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CHIEF'S ITEMS
WOLFEBORO POLICE COMMISSION MEETING
AUGUST 24, 2023

IN GENERAL

Those who drive by the Public Safety building will notice that prep work has begun on the project. Temporary fencing, some tree-clearing, electricity, and field office equipment is being installed and we are clearing our parking lots for access/egress of construction equipment.

We are grateful to All Saints Episcopal Church for sharing their parking lot for our employee's vehicles during construction. Thank you for partnering with us!

We will be auctioning off a "retired" police cruiser if any project-minded people are interested in submitting a bid on a Ford "Interceptor" vehicle. The legal announcement will be in the Grunter and you can find it soon on our Facebook page.

In anticipation of our needs during the building renovation, Supervisor Lyons will soon be doing a "walk-through" with our

radio providers at Huggins Hospital. We are exploring the possibility of utilizing some unoccupied space at that facility.

The State's new Law Enforcement Accreditation program was launched on July 20, 2023. It is especially designed to be both affordable and achievable for agencies of our size. The program's 114 current standards reflect industry best practices in each critical area of law enforcement authority including management, operations, investigations, records and support services. These standards reflect what agencies should be doing but not how they should do it.

Toward that end, we are reviewing and revising our own sop's to bring them into compliance with accreditation standards. Ideally, we will be completing this self-assessment around the time the public safety building project has been completed.

In addition to having recruit McGee at the academy in Concord, two of our seasoned staff members have been there recently in a teaching capacity: Lt Guy Maloney – Accident Reconstruction, Corporal Jason Boucher – firearms training.

IN SERVICE TRAINING

Office Jake Boucher recently completed the Field Training Officer Class.

Several Department members attended the Active Attack Integrated Response Train the Trainer Course held at Kingswood Regional High School. This was a 40-hour, comprehensive course attended by many area departments and first responders.

Captain Mark Livie, Sgt. Jared Beaulieu, Corporal Eric LaRochelle and SRO Mary Devine represented Wolfeboro. Corporal Boucher was active in getting the teaching team and all the equipment on scene. He spent many hours assisting at the school as well.

Here is a brief description of the course-content: "The course is a 40-hour performance level direct delivery course designed to improve integration between law enforcement, fire, telecommunicator and EMS in active attack /shooter events. The course provides law enforcement officers with key medical skills based on tactical emergency casualty care guidelines, which can be used at the point of injury to increase survivability of victims. The course also provides a model framework for responders to integrate operations during an active attack /shooter event through the rescue task force concept....."

Thank you to the KRHS faculty and staff members who assisted in the active scenario scenes and for providing us with the training space.

Sgt. Patrick Spera completed phase 2 of the FBI's Law enforcement executive development program held in Bow.

There was a tragic, fatal jet ski accident on Crescent Lake earlier this summer. In the grief that follows, the first responders are sometimes left to deal with the trauma and tragedy on their own. We were pleased to have the Southern New Hampshire Critical Incident Stress Management Team on hand at Huggins Hospital on August 8th to assist our Town First Responders and EMS personnel who were involved in that incident. We thank them and Huggins Hospital for their support.

The 2024, Police, Central Dispatch and Animal Control budgets are being prepared for presentation. Proposals are due at the Town Manager's office on September 8th, followed by the Selectmen on October 12th at 6:00PM @ Great Hall followed by the Budget Committee on November 14th at the Library.

We appeared at the Wolfeboro Community Television Studio to tape the "Coffee and Connection with the Chief" (and Captain) in this reporting period. The next segment has been

rescheduled for Wednesday, August 30th @ 1000 hours. On the bandstand at Cate Park.

A “tip of the fedora” to Selectman Deshaies and his efforts on the widely successful, “Lake Winnepesaukee Day” event at our Town Docks recently. I went through town that evening and was amazed at the number of attendees – estimated to be about 15,000. Detail officers reported the crowd was enthusiastic and orderly and a good time was had by all.
