## **Activity Reports**

Captain Livie reported on the following activity reports for the month of August:

**Incidents:** He reported 54 incidents, an increase from the previous month.

Offenses by month: He reported 60 offenses for the month.

Arrest status report: He reported a decrease of 37.14% in arrests from the previous month, for a total of 22.

Collisions report: He reported a decrease over the last three months and there were 17 collisions in August.

Traffic stops report: He reported 151 traffic stops, a decrease from last month, and 8 tickets were issued out of those stops.

Personnel Analysis report: The report is a synopsis of each officer's activity for the month.

Captain Livie shared a budget review and let the Commissioners know that the Police budget is underspent by 2.62%, doing very well overall. He also wanted to inform the Commissioners about a purchase order (for \$39,000) that has been submitted to pay the Lakes Region Humane Society for care for a cat case. The Captain applied for a grant from NH Department of Agricultural. October is when the grant gets submitted and is hoping it will be approved and granted because it would be for \$37,000 to help defray the cost from the cat case.

Chairman Wood shared that he wanted to speak to social media postings following the release of the MRI report, the redacted version. He went on to share that following the findings from the investigation from MRI, the Commission found the report to be flawed, incomplete and lacking context. It seemed too illicit more questions than answers and as such the Commission as initiated an internal affairs investigation, which is running in addition to the MRI investigation. The Commission is doing this thoroughly and are also working with the NH Police Standards and Training Conduct Review Committee Attorney to make sure that they are following all the correct processes and procedures as we move forward. So once again, like when the MRI investigation was conducted, the Commission is asking for everyone's patience and understanding. Please give them the time to get it done and when it is complete whatever information that can be released will be released. He went on to say that this is by no means being swept under the carpet or swept aside, they are just digging deeper.

The Commission re-entered public session at 5:15 PM.


Chairman Wood entertained a motion to seal the Non-Public Minutes.


Being no further business before the Commission, Chairman Wood entertained a motion to adjourn.






## **ARRESTS YTD 2023**

## WOLFEBORO POLICE COMMISSION MEETING SEPTEMBER 21, 2023

## IN GENERAL:

HEAVY CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT AND TRAFFIC ARE THE ORDER OF BUSINESS HERE AT 251 SOUTH MAIN STREET THESE DAYS AS "PHASE ONE" OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING MOVES ALONG. WE ARE HAVING WEEKLY MEETINGS WITH ALL THE PRINCIPLES TO KEEP INFORMED OF THE PROGRESS. THANKS AGAIN TO ALL OUR NEIGHBORS FOR THEIR UNDERSTANDING AND ASSISTANCE DURING THIS PROJECT.

A 911 REPORT OF GUN-SHOT VICTIM ON ELM STREET TUESDAY AFTERNOON RESULTED IN AN "ALL-HANDS" RESPONSE WITH APPROPRIATE DEFENSIVE MEASURES BEING TAKEN BY OUR OFFICERS. THE CALL PROVED TO BE A COLLOSAL MISUNDERSTANDING ON THE PART OF THE REPORTING PARTY BUT THERE WAS A STRONG PRESENCE AT THAT SCENE FOR A HALF HOUR OR SO. AFTER "THE DUST SETTLED" AND AFTER A COUPLE OF INTERVIEWS, THERE WAS NO CRIME AND NO FURTHER ACTION REQUIRED.

WE RECENTLY DID A WALK-THROUGH AT HUGGINS HOSPITAL TO VIEW AVAILABLE SPACE TO TEMPORARILY HOUSE CENTRAL DISPATCH DURING UPCOMING RENOVATIONS OF OUR PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING. WE ARE PLEASED TO REPORT THAT THIS LOOKS LIKE AN IDEAL SITUATION ON ALL FRONTS. THANK YOU, HUGGINS HOSPITAL FOR OFFERING THIS SPACE. JUST TO OFFER A SENSE OF LOCALE, THE SPACE IS WHERE COVID SHOTS WERE ADMINISTERED DURING THE PANDEMIC.

TOWN EMPLOYEES WERE RECOGNIZED LAST FRIDAY AT EMPLOYEE APPRECIATION DAY. MILESTONES IN OUR DEPARTMENT INCLUDED: SHERRI MOORE (5 YEARS OF FULL-TIME SERVICE), MIA LYONS (20 YEARS) AND CAPTAIN LIVIE (20 YEARS).

I SPENT SOME TIME WITH SRO(S) DEVINE AND LAROCHELLE LAST WEEK AND GOT A BRIEF TOUR.

KEVIN DUFFY, DIRECTOR OF SECURITY AT BREWSTER ACADEMY, INVITED US TO SPEAK TO THE INCOMING CLASS OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS. CAPTIAN LIVIE DID THE HONORS. THE CAPTAIN AND I MET WITH OUR SUPERINTENDANT OF SCHOOLS ON MATTERS OF MUTUAL INTEREST AND CONCERN.

I ATTENDED THE RECEPTION FOR NEW STAFF AND FACULTY MEMBERS AT THE FINE ARTS BUILDING AT OUR HIGH SCHOOL.
