Policy To strictly adhere to RSA 262:32 when handling abandoned vehicles.

- Records on towed vehicles shall be maintained and must include officer's name, time, date, reason and location of towed vehicle.
- The owner of the vehicle pays all expenses of the tow and storage.
- If the owner wishes to challenge that there were not sufficient grounds for towing and storage, he must contact the Chief of Police in writing.

The Chief will determine if sufficient grounds did exist. If they do not, the police department will pay the expense.

Highway Hazards

- Roadway defects, signs missing or damaged, debris in the road, missing or damaged traffic control devices or damaged guardrails etc. shall be reported to the proper department or agency for repair/replacement.
- If the hazard poses an immediate danger or if traffic control is necessary, the officer will provide security or traffic control until the hazard is removed.

Tow Companies

The Wolfeboro Police Department choose to identify Crowell's Towing as the Towns primary and only company for towing. A contract has been drafted and approved by the Wolfeboro Police Commissioners. A current copy of their insurance coverage on file with the Executive Administrative Assistant and has a secure lot.

SOP 3.17 Towing Vehicles & Hazards

Vehicles left on the Wolfeboro Police Department's grounds due to being towed for violations of an RSA, Search warrant, or any other reason that is lawful. The vehicle will be towed off the property after seven (7) days, despite the officers'/dispatacher best efforts to contact the owner to remove the vehicle.
