Alzheimer's Program

Purpose

As part of our mission to protect life and to assist the public-at-large in a manner consistent with the rights and dignity of all persons, the Wolfeboro Police Department has developed an Alzheimer Assistance Program to rapidly respond in the event that an Alzheimer patient should become lost.

Program Details

If you are the caregiver for someone living in Wolfeboro who has been diagnosed with Alzheimer or an elderly person who tends to wander or get lost, please fill out and contact the Wolfeboro Police Department at 603-569-1444. Advise the Dispatcher Supervisor Mia Lyons that you would like to have someone included in the Alzheimer Assistance Program. An officer will be directed to the resident's address and will assist you in filling out an Alzheimer Assistance Program Information Sheet.

This simple, 1-page, form includes information that will help us identify the person, such as height, weight, hair and eye color, as well as provide names of emergency contact people and medical information such as preferred hospital, primary care physician, allergies, and medications. It is necessary to have a photograph of the person. The officer will take a photograph if a recent one is not readily available.

All of the information you provide will be entered into our computer system along with the photograph and an Information Poster will be generated. A copy of this poster will be given to all of the emergency contact people listed on the Alzheimer Patient Information Sheet.

Missing Person

If the Alzheimer Patient becomes lost, call the Wolfeboro Police Department immediately and advise the Dispatcher that answers that the lost person is a participant in the Alzheimer Assistance Program. An officer will be dispatched to locate the missing person.
